

# Why is reading important?

- Opens up the world around us
- Provides the children with many opportunities
- Helps them to access learning
- Has a huge impact on a child's attainment



#### What is Phonics?

- Phonics is a method of teaching reading and writing
- It develops phonemic awareness –
   the ability to hear, recognise and use
   the sounds within words
- Phonics is currently the main way in which children are taught to read in schools
- Phonics teaches the link between the words we read/ say and the words we write on the page. It teaches how the letters in written words represent the sounds we say in spoken words – this is called decoding.







#### Vocabulary

- Grapheme the written letter or groups of letters
- Phoneme the sounds that the grapheme makes.
- GPC (grapheme, phoneme correspondence) – the match between a phoneme and a grapheme
- Digraph two letters together that make one sound e.g. shop
- Trigraph three letters together that make one sound e.g. light







#### How GPCs are taught


Children are introduced to 4 new GPCs every week in their daily phonics lessons.


In Reception they are taught an action for all Phase 2 and Phase 3 phonemes as well as a picture to support their new learning.

Lessons give all children the opportunity to blend (read) and segment (write).






#### Blending

 Putting together the sounds in a word to read the word e.g m-a-n is man











## Segmenting

- Separating the sounds in a word to the spell the word
- Daily writing as part of phonics lessons
- Stretch the word out
- Use phoneme fingers









#### **Unlocking Letters and Sounds**

#### Actions, Images and Handwriting - Phase 2

- These are simple, clear actions that don't impede the child saying the sound
- The sound is only voiced once, so that the teacher can spot those children who are saying the sound slightly behind the rest of the group
- . The actions also help warm up hands and fingers, ready for writing

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#### **Common Exception** Words

Words that are not phonetically decodable or that children can't yet decode as they haven't yet been taught the phonemes.

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#### Reading and Books

- Children will be given books when they can blend – this will be different for every child
- Books precisely match children's phonics attainment













#### Reading at home

- 5 10 minutes
- Choose a time that works for you
- Be positive and celebrate successes
- Encourage them to point to the graphemes
- Encourage them to say the sounds and blend them together
- Be patient and let them try and work it out
- Read common exception words by sight.

#### Reading at home

- Continue to read to your child.
- Model how to read a book left to right, turning pages
- Ask questions about what has happened and characters' feelings
- Support vocabulary
- Predict what will happen next
- Make connections
- Model your love of reading!

#### Progress

- All children are different and learn at a different pace
- Discuss any concerns with teachers
- Teachers will assess your child reguarly
- Interventions to support child in the specific skill they are struggling with
- Adaptions for children with SEND
