
term will be a welcome break for them and for all of us and we look forward to welcoming the children back on Tuesday 6 June after our training day.



2 - Neurodiversity and Inclusion

Last Friday, we were incredibly fortunate to be visited by five pupils from Houlton School who led powerful assemblies about neurodiversity and inclusion.

Four of the Houlton pupils led an assembly to our KS2 children and shared their experience of autism, ADHD and dyslexia. They also spoke about how their friends and the adults in their lives support them through any difficulties they face, with a particular focus on how they manage the demands of school life. A particularly poignant moment was when one of the pupils shared a poem he had written about neurodiversity, bringing some of our teachers to tears! Our KS2 pupils engaged so well with the assemblies by showing an immense amount of respect, by asking relevant questions and then engaging well in conversations with their teachers afterwards.

KS1 were visited by a fifth Houlton pupil later in the morning, who spoke to them about her experience of autism and what it means to have a brain that works slightly differently to other people. The KS1 pupils asked some fantastic questions, and were wonderfully welcoming towards their special guest.

We thoroughly enjoyed linking up with Houlton School to talk about inclusion — our children made the students feel very welcome, and as a result they are keen to come back to visit us in the future! Overall, as a staff team we felt very proud to be Paddox teachers that day, and there was a brilliant atmosphere around school. It was great to give neurodiversity the spotlight that it deserved, and long may the conversations continue!

P.E Update from Mrs Knight





Absence: If your child is not going to be in school please ensure you notify the school office via telephone on 01788 572340 or email to admin2625@welearn365.com⁴

If you wish to take your child out of school for any other reason other than illness or medical appointments, you need to request an **Application for Leave of Absence for a School Pupil in Term Time** form for each child. This should be completed and returned to the school office prior to the absence for Ms Guymer to review and respond. Please give as much advance notice as possible.

Lost Property: Please can you make sure that ALL items of uniform are **clearly labelled** with your child's name and class. LARRY is full again of unnamed lost property which we can't return to rightful owners! LARRY is wheeled out to the playground by the year 6 doors every Friday morning and afterschool (weather permitting). Please check to see if any items belong to your children.

Nut Free and Sesame Seed Free Zone: Paddox is a NUT FREE and SESAME SEED FREE ZONE. We do not allow these items in school. This also applies to **any school trips** that take place and require your child to bring a packed lunch. We have an increasing number of children with severe allergies to nuts and/or sesame seeds.
