A week in numbers

We thought we'd give you a snapshot of a week at Paddox with some interesting statistics about this week:

- 1916 school dinners served
- 529 parents signed up to ParentApps Connect
- 272 children attended an event not in school (Brownlee Triathlon, Ashmolean Museum, Warwick Castle)
 - 174 late arrivals recorded
 - 142 children attended one of our teacher-led afterschool clubs
 - 96% overall attendance
- 39 children either left school early or came to school late due to various appointments (e.g. drs, dentist etc)

What's been happening in school this week?



1 - A huge thank you to those who came along to buy Hama bead cards for the Year 2 Responsible Active Citizenship Fundraiser.

We made £123.75 for the Air Ambulance!

This week, we have embarked on a new journey with regards to the verbal and written feedback provided to the children during and after lessons. The aim of the trial is to ensure the feedback provided is purposeful for the children to move their learning on either within the lesson itself, or by highlighting key themes within a lesson to review at the start of the following lesson. This will allow teaching staff to provide more live verbal feedback within the lesson and then spend more time adapting resources for the following lesson. In order to be effective as possible, we are trialling three new approaches to written feedback across school. One approach is adapted from our current feedback policy and the other two are different approaches which involve reduced written feedback in the children's books.

Following the trial period, staff will be feeding back to senior leaders to identify the most effective feedback approach for the children which will be fully implemented ready for the new academic year in September.



2 - On Tuesday 20 June, Year 3 visited the Ashmolean Museum in Oxford to view their comprehensive Ancient Egypt collection. As we are at the start of our topic, the children were excited to learn about aspects of the civilisation first hand by exploring the artefacts displayed. After a dash to the coach in the torrential rain and a journey down the M40, we arrived in Oxford and got straight to it! The children were brilliant detectives who moved around the museum respectfully to find information about the artefacts. We also took part in a workshop which was led by a specialist from the museum. She shared detailed information about the different sections of the collection and how they compared to us today, including jewellery, games, hunting equipment, and decorations. The children even got the chance to handle an artefact where they used their detective skills to work out what the original object was. Finally, we visited the two Ancient Egyptian mummies they have at the museum – the most elaborate being one of a priest who had three decorative layers to his coffin. Overall, we had a fantastic time at the museum which has provided an insightful start to our new topic!

For the benefit of all children and staff, some of which have severe allergies to ingredients in this product, we ask that you do not send your child / children into school wearing this suncream. 
